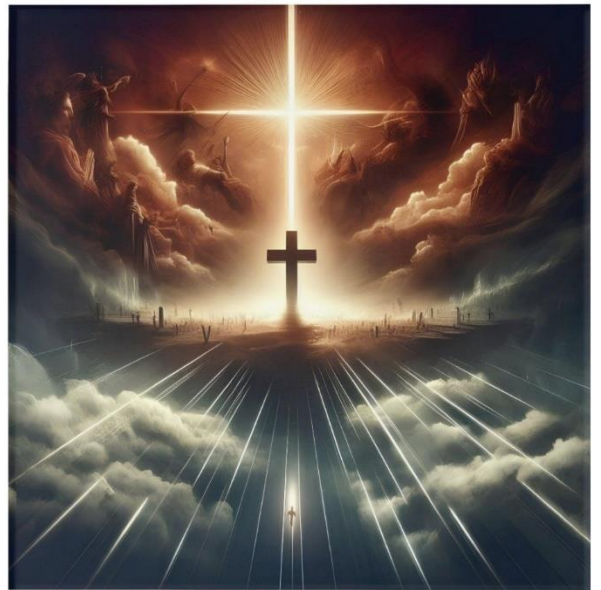

Once again the Christmas season brought many opportunities to reach out to our community.

The first week we collected chocolate Advent calendars, then items such as biscuits, chocolates etc., followed by toiletries and general food items on subsequent Sundays.

The Food Banks run by the Salvation Army and Eyres Monsell Community Centre were extremely grateful for our contributions, and we pray God's blessing on all the volunteers working there who give their time to help those going through difficult times.

The **CHRISTMAS MARKET**

saw crowds of people coming through our doors. They loved the beautiful gifts on sale - crocheted, knitted, woodworked by our talented crafters and sold at very reasonable prices.

The Children's Christmas Trail

was very popular as the children moved through various craft activities



portraying the Christmas story, and ended up in Santa's wonderland where they sent their Christmas wishes via a special post-box and received a small gift and sweeties. Of course many of the letters to Santa were a list of "I wants", but one child just listed things she wished for others this Christmas. (It brought a tear to the eye of both Mum and the Christmas Elf). The cake

and pie stalls were swiftly emptied, and the bric-a-brac supplied the bargains. Lunches were very welcome, with most choosing the full Christmas dinner or hot turkey roll, but with other alternatives.

(Comments on the food: Sandra's home-made sausage rolls "*better than Greggs*", Dorothy's home-made vegetarian pie "*better than Melton Mowbray*"). Thanks to all who worked together for this event. Over £1,500 was raised in the three hours, and also many lovely conversations and new connections made.

The church garden looked beautiful lit up with fairy lights over the church, the tunnel along the path, the Christmas tree (thanks to the Man Alive group for setting this up). The brass band sat under a small gazebo and led the carols, the children from Granby School Choir sang. From the side door onto the new patio hot drinks (mainly hot chocolate) were served, also mince pies. Stan gave a short talk centring on Angels, with around 200 people gathered there on a still, moonlit night, one could almost hear the angels sing.

The **Sunday Morning Carol Service**, led by Jill, was very well attended, and all enjoyed singing the carols just days from Christmas day. The under five group performed “jingle bells” accompanied by a video, which was very heartwarming and nobody minded that they may have “jingled” through Silent Night!

Monday evening and **Carols in the Pub** held at the Black Horse with carols accompanied by a brass band was bursting at the seams with about 400 crammed into the pub garden. Carols were sung, the Christmas Bible readings were given and a short gospel message from Stan – all was very well received. A charity collection was taken for Rainbows Children’s Hospice and LOROS Hospice.



Finally Christmas arrived. The late night **Christmas Eve Communion** and we welcomed visitors to this special and poignant service, and were able to sing the last verse of ‘O come All Ye Faithful’ as the clock ticked over from midnight and heralded Christmas Day “Yea Lord we greet Thee, born this happy morning.”

Christmas Morning, Mari led a lovely service, which included a mention of a very special gift of “Paddington Bear”, symbolising a mother’s love, and reminding us of the lengths that Jesus went to in order to show us how much He loves us.

Love Came Down at Christmas – and is a gift for all eternity.

A very big “thank you” to all the volunteers who give so freely of their time each week and we look forward to the New Year and many more shared meals together.

A true Good News story for the New Year ...

The Story of actor Jamie Hinde.

My parents went through a pretty heavy divorce when I was about eleven. I was brought up by my mum and saw my dad once a week. Mum was a theatre director and at about twelve I was cast in her production of *Sound of Music*, playing Kurt. After this I started attending an acting workshop, where I made lots of friends. But at school it was a different story – I didn't fit in, did very badly at school. Started off in the 'A' stream and went down to 'C' stream. I hated it so much I bunked off as much as possible. I left at 17 with hardly any qualifications and went to drama college in Chiswick.

Then, when I was 18, an amazing thing happened. I got an audition for *The Wizard of Oz* with the Royal Shakespeare Co. and later was invited to audition for their season. I learned something from "The Tempest" for audition, but completely froze up when I went on stage, leaving the theatre in tears thinking I had wrecked my chances. Amazingly the next day my agent phoned to say they had offered me sixty weeks work. I later asked them why and they said "You know when somebody walks in the room – it's not about drying up."

We travelled the country, and then they offered me another year but I took a risk and left, and then was offered a part at the National theatre.

My career blossomed, I travelled all over the world. I was 25 and working in South America, the Philippines, Los Angeles. I was being invited to lavish parties and meeting very famous people. After that I played in the London West End, and after that I went to teach in a drama college whilst I was between jobs. By then I'd bought a lovely flat in Winchmore Hill, North London. I set up my own company called Fly Monkey.

But something inside me was dissatisfied and I went on a spiritual search. I read books on Buddhism, Taoism. Then I decided to return to acting and auditioned for the *Lion King*. It was very well paid (Disney look after you very well indeed), but being a performer just didn't have the same buzz for me. I remember one night, I was playing Scar – one of the leading roles – in front of 2,500 people and I stood there and thought – "I don't feel anything". Then, during the latter part of my year there I attended the final three sessions of the Theatreland Alpha Course. I had loads of questions.

My big question was, “I believe I’m a good guy. Why should you be allowed into heaven and not me? Why is it exclusive?”

Soon after that I decided to leave the Lion King. I just felt there was something else. When I left I didn’t know what I was going to do.

At the end of 2004 a friend who is a Christian took me to a morning service at Holy Trinity, Brompton – she told me it was an Anglican church where she sometimes went. Within seconds of arriving there I burst into tears. I didn’t know why. As I sat there crying the Alpha Course was mentioned and she encouraged me to do the course. I said yes. That was January 2005. When I arrived at Alpha I was in a bad way. I was drifting with no zest for anything. I had this cynicism. I thought “Is that a sincere smile?” every cynical bone in my body was going, “what am I doing here”, but I was enjoying the talks.

Then an amazing thing happened – 29th January 2005. I went away for the weekend to Cardiff to visit my godson for the first time. By this stage on Alpha something in my heart had clicked. On the train I took the “Why Jesus” booklet. I came to the prayer at the back and decided to say it. It was something along the lines of “Dear Lord Jesus, please forgive me for my sins. Thank you for dying on the cross for me. I ask you to come into my life, heal my life and guide my life.” And I can’t explain what happened, but it was the most amazing, profound experience. I expected nothing – I was just saying the prayer. But I said it with integrity, with force and with absolute meaning. I was at peace, serene, joyful and blissful. I felt incredible. The Spirit was coming into me and saying “Jamie, it’s true. Let’s go for it.” And I remember having an image of Jesus in me. I could see Him – not looking at me, but it was like He was in me. It was an overwhelming experience and it went on for about 20 minutes.

The following week I told the Alpha Course group what had happened, and most of our group became Christians and formed a House Group. But it hasn’t been easy, taking a self-centred life and becoming God-centred, and the process has been going on ever since. I’ve cried tears I didn’t even know existed – going right back to my parent’s divorce, from deep within.

I know now that I want to serve God. I’m at the stage where I know where I’m going, “OK – use me....I want to glorify God in every way I can. I feel so blessed.”
